

Grant County Fiscal Court Regular Meeting Minutes August 3, 2021 6:30 P.M.

The Grant County Fiscal Court met in regular session on Tuesday, August 6, 2021 at 6:30 P.M. in Williamstown, Kentucky. Those in attendance include the Honorable Judge/Executive Chuck Dills, Magistrate Roger Humphrey, Magistrate Shawna Coldiron and Magistrate Jacqalynn Riley, County Attorney Steven Bates II, Fiscal Court Clerk Cherish Kennedy, and Deputy Judge/Executive Colton Simpson. Also joining was Philip Knarr, David Rose, Mike Webster, Brian Maines, Steve Coldiron, and John Sauder.

Invocation was led by Colton Simpson Deputy Judge/Executive and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Judge/Executive Chuck Dills.

Motion was made by Magistrate Humphrey and seconded by Magistrate Coldiron to approve the regular meeting minutes of July 20, 2021. All in favor, motion carried.

Motion was made by Magistrate Riley and seconded by Magistrate Humphrey to approve all claims drawn in the general fund, road fund, and jail fund along with all transfers presented dated August 3, 2021. All in favor, motion carried.

Motion was made by Magistrate Coldiron and seconded by Magistrate Riley to approve the presented Tax Rates for tax year 2021-2022. All in favor, motion carried.

Motion was made by Magistrate Humphrey and seconded by Magistrate Coldiron to approve the appointment of Greg Stephens as a laborer with the Grant County Road Department effective August 2, 2021. All in favor, motion carried.

Motion was made by Magistrate Riley and seconded by Magistrate Coldiron to approve a zone change for David Hammond from A-1 to R1A on 1.5081 acres on KY 36, Dry Ridge, KY. All in favor, motion carried.

Motion was made by Magistrate Humphrey and seconded by Magistrate Coldiron to approve a zone change for Thomas Schmucker from A-1 to Rural Residential (RR) on 6.4989 acres on Clark Creek Road, Dry Ridge, KY. All in favor, motion carried.

Motion was made by Magistrate Coldiron and seconded by Magistrate Humphrey to approve a zone change for Terry and Patricia Conrad from A-1 to R1A on 1.0862 acres on Dry Ridge Mt Zion Road, Dry Ridge KY. All in favor, motion carried.

Motion was made by Magistrate Humphrey and seconded by Magistrate Riley to approve a zone change for Ron Colson and Tim Beach from A-1 to R1A on 3.1418 acres on Sherman Mt Zion Road, Dry Ridge, KY. All in favor, motion carried.

Reports were presented from the Treasurer, Animal Shelter, Road Supervisor, Building Inspector, Jailer, Sheriff, Judge/Executive, and each Magistrate. These reports are for review only and no action is required.

Judge/Executive Chuck Dills asked the audience if they wished to address the court. 

Be it resolved by the Fiscal Court that:

The Fiscal Court does hereby certify that all roads and streets referred to in said Agreement are county roads as defined in KRS 178.010(1)(b); and

The Fiscal Court does hereby ratify and adopt all statements, representations, warranties, covenants, and agreements contained in said Agreement and does hereby accept said Agreement and by such acceptance agrees to all the terms and conditions therein stated; and

The County Judge/Executive of the county is hereby authorized and directed to sign said Agreement as set forth on behalf of the Fiscal Court of GRANT County, and the County Clerk of GRANT County is hereby authorized and directed to certify thereto.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN
COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY
TRANSPORTATION CABINET
DEPARTMENT OF RURAL AND MUNICIPAL AID
AND
GRANT COUNTY

**THIS AGREEMENT**, entered into by and between the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Transportation Cabinet, Department of Rural and Municipal Aid, hereinafter referred to as the "**Department**" and the GRANT COUNTY Fiscal Court, hereinafter referred to as the "**County**."

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, it would be to the benefit of the traveling public to perform bituminous resurfacing with hot mix asphalt on various county roads (see authorized locations attachment), which shall hereinafter be referred to as the "Project"; and

WHEREAS, the County has expressed its desire to perform the work for the aforementioned **Project** and to be responsible for all phases of the **Project**;

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of these premises and the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- The **Department** shall be responsible for providing Rural Secondary funding in an amount not to exceed \$316,004 for the reimbursement of the abovementioned Project.
- 2. If the Project is performed by Contract, the County shall employ only contractors prequalified by the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet for the work items included in the Project and shall comply with all legal bidding requirements including, but not limited to, the provisions of KRS 45A and 424. Concurrence must be obtained by the County through the DISTRICT 6 Chief District Engineer in COVINGTON, KY, prior to the awarding of any contract for work or materials to be used on this Project.

- 3. The County shall cause the Project to be constructed to a level which meets applicable county road and bridge standards (all bridges will be required to meet or exceed an H-20 loading); approval from Bridge Preservation Branch of Division of Maintenance MUST BE OBTAINED before ANY additional load is added to any inventoried structure. Furthermore, all materials paid for by the Department used on, or incorporated into, the Project shall meet the requirements specified in the Highway Department's Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction, current edition of State Specifications guidelines. The County will obtain any required permits or approval of plans for work to be accomplished on state-owned right-of-way from the Cabinet's **DISTRICT 6 Office in COVINGTON, KY**. The County hereby agrees to put forth a reasonable effort to do maintenance on roads listed herein prior to bituminous surface being applied. Maintenance being defined as, but not limited to, proper ditching, cleaning or replacement of clogged or deficient drain tiles, proper shouldering, surface preparation, and any other obvious maintenance the road may need. In accordance with, Kentucky Revised Statutes (KRS) §179.380 and 603 Kentucky Administrative Regulation (KAR) §1:020, The County further agrees that placement of a culvert or road tile shall be required for any new entrance constructed that effects the drainage area surrounding any of the roads listed in the agreement. The manner as to the implementation of this requirement shall be at the discretion of the County as permitted by State or Federal law. The minimum thickness of any bituminous surface applied shall be one inch.
- 4. The County shall indemnify and hold harmless the Department and all of its officers, agents, and employees from all suits, actions, or claims of any character because of any injuries or damages received by any person, persons, or property resulting from construction of the Project.
- 5. The **Department** shall reimburse the **County** up to \$316,004 for completion of work by the **County** under the obligations of this agreement, which shall represent the total obligation of the **Department**.
- 6. The **County** agrees to be responsible for all cost above \$316,004; however, the **County** shall not be required to expend any more than \$316,004.
- 7. The effective date of this Agreement is the date of signature by the Secretary of the Transportation Cabinet.

  The Term of Eligible Reimbursement under this Agreement shall be three (3) years from the date of its

execution unless extended or amended by written Agreement in accordance with the provisions of KRS 45A.

Any and all funding obligated for any phase of this **Project** shall be available to reimburse the **County** for eligible work activities completed and costs incurred prior to expiration.

- 8. The County shall maintain for a period of three (3) years, after the Rural Secondary Office within the Department issues a project close date, all records of material, equipment, and labor costs involved in the performance of the work for the Project. These records may be subject to audit by the Transportation Cabinet. In order to obtain reimbursement from the Department for the Project, the County shall submit to the Office of Rural and Secondary Roads documented invoices of materials, equipment, and labor used on the Project, including certification that the work was accomplished on a publicly maintained facility in accordance with this agreement.
- 9. The County may submit current billing reflecting the actual cost of the project during any given work period. This bill should indicate if it is for partial payment or final payment. The current billings will be paid within a reasonable time after receipt of same by the Department; however, in no event is the County to submit billings for work performed for less than a thirty-day (30) period.
- 10. The **Department** reserves the right to inspect the methods used in order to perform the work necessary to successfully complete the **Project** and also reserves the right to cease all work commenced under the terms of this agreement at any time.
- 11. The **County** will pass the attached Resolution and a copy of that resolution shall be attached to and made a part of this Agreement.

# MOA/PSC Exception Standard Terms and Conditions (Revised December 2019)

Whereas, the first party, the state agency, has concluded that either state personnel are not available to perform said function, or it would not be feasible to utilize state personnel to perform said function; and Whereas, the second party, the Contractor, is available and qualified to perform such function; and Whereas, for the abovementioned reasons, the state agency desires to avail itself of the services of the second party;

**NOW THEREFORE**, the following terms and conditions are applicable to this contract:

#### 1.00 Effective Date:

This contract is not effective until the Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet or his authorized designee has approved the contract and until the contract has been submitted to the Legislative Research Commission, Government Contract Review Committee ("LRC"). However, in accordance with KRS 45A.700, contracts in aggregate amounts of \$10,000 or less are exempt from review by the committee and need only be filed with the committee within 30 days of their effective date for informational purposes.

KRS 45A.695(7) provides that payments on personal service contracts and memoranda of agreement shall not be authorized for services rendered after government contract review committee disapproval, unless the decision of the committee is overridden by the Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet or agency head, if the agency has been granted delegation authority by the Secretary.

#### 2.00 LRC Policies:

This section does not apply to governmental or quasi-governmental entities.

Pursuant to KRS 45A.725, LRC has established policies which govern rates payable for certain professional services. These are located on the LRC webpage

https://apps.legislature.ky.gov/moreinfo/Contracts/homepage.html and would impact any contract established under KRS 45A.690 et seq., where applicable.

#### 3.00 Choice of Law and Forum:

This section does not apply to governmental or quasi-governmental entities.

This contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Any action brought against the Commonwealth on the contract, including but not limited to actions either for breach of contract or for enforcement of the contract, shall be brought in Franklin Circuit Court, Franklin County, Kentucky in accordance with KRS 45A.245.

#### 4.00 EEO Requirements

The Equal Employment Opportunity Act of 1978 applies to All State government projects with an estimated value exceeding \$500,000. The contractor shall comply with all terms and conditions of the Act.

#### 5.00 Cancellation:

Both parties shall have the right to terminate and cancel this contract at any time not to exceed thirty (30) days' written notice served on the other party by registered or certified mail.

#### 6.00 Funding Out Provision:

The state agency may terminate this contract if funds are not appropriated to the contracting agency or are not otherwise available for the purpose of making payments without incurring any obligation for payment after the date of termination, regardless of the terms of the contract. The state agency shall provide the Contractor thirty (30) calendar days' written notice of termination of the contract due to lack of available funding.

#### 7.00 Reduction in Contract Worker Hours:

The Kentucky General Assembly may allow for a reduction in contract worker hours in conjunction with a budget balancing measure for some professional and non-professional service contracts. If under such authority the agency is required by Executive Order or otherwise to reduce contract hours, the agreement will be reduced by the amount specified in that document. If the contract funding is reduced, then the scope of work related to the contract may also be reduced commensurate with the reduction in funding. This reduction of the scope shall be agreeable to both parties and shall not be considered a breach of contract.

8.00 Authorized to do Business in Kentucky:

This section does not apply to governmental or quasi-governmental entities.

Registration with the Secretary of State by a Foreign Entity:

Pursuant to KRS 45A.480(1)(b), an agency, department, office, or political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Kentucky shall not award a state contract to a person that is a foreign entity required by KRS 14A.9-010 to obtain a certificate of authority to transact business in the Commonwealth ("certificate") from the Secretary of State under KRS 14A.9-030 unless the person produces the certificate within fourteen (14) days of the bid or proposal opening. #### 11.00 Other expenses, if authorized herein:

#### This section does not apply to governmental or quasi-governmental entities.

The Contractor shall be reimbursed for no other expenses of any kind, unless and except as specifically authorized within the specifications of this contract or authorized in advance and in writing by the Commonwealth.

If the reimbursement of such expenses is authorized, the reimbursement shall be only on an out-of-pocket basis. Request for payment of same shall be processed upon receipt from the Contractor of valid, itemized statements submitted periodically for payment at the time any fees are due. The Contractor shall maintain supporting documents that substantiate every claim for expenses and shall furnish same if requested by the Commonwealth.

#### 12.00 Purchasing and specifications:

#### This section does not apply to governmental or quasi-governmental entities.

### Grant County Conservation District Annual Report July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021

The Grant County Conservation District programs are administered by an elected Board of seven Supervisors. The current Board of Supervisors consists of Timothy T. Epperson as Chairman, Billy E. Courts as Vice-Chairman, Jerry L. Martin as Secretary/Treasurer, Ronald D. Gabbert, Edna M. Cummins, James F. Morris, Jr. and James Travis Woodyard.

The Board of Supervisors for the Grant County Conservation District submit the following report: Funding for the Conservation District comes from local and state tax monies. While the current rate is 0.01%, the tax base generates enough revenue to fund high quality programs within Grant County. Kim Barton, Area Field Representative with the Kentucky Division of Conservation provides administrative assistance to the District. Rebecca Peddicord, the District's Administrative Secretary administers the organization and implementation of District business and programs. Ian Young, Supervisory District Conservationist with the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) provides technical assistance for conservation planning and application of practices.

The Grant County Conservation District remains an honored member of the National Association of Conservation Districts, Kentucky Association of Conservation Districts, Kentucky Association of Conservation Districts Employees, and the Grant County Chamber of Commerce.

In 2020-2021 the goal of NRCS and the Grant County Conservation staff was to provide assistance to Grant County landowners concerning conservation planning, rotational grazing systems, wildlife habitat improvement, forestry practices, animal waste control, nutrient management, storm water runoff, drainage, erosion and sediment control, and other conservation needs. Two new Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) applications were accepted and one was approved for funding. NRCS is addressing resource needs on 103 acres with an estimated cost of \$38,992.00. Grant County also had one application for the Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP.)

Each fall the Grant County Conservation District sponsors a local cost share program for Grant County producers to help with the cost of sowing wheat, rye or other cover crop seed. The Grant County Conservation District Local Cost Share pays 60% of the total cost of the cover crop seed that was used, up to a maximum of \$300.00 per Farm Service Number. The final 2020 Local Cost Share Program totals: Six producers with eight FSN#s participated, \$1,164.12 in funds was dispersed and 103 acres were sown with the majority of acres being sown with wheat seed.

The Grant County Conservation District promotes conservation by providing the following three equipment rentals: a Blue Ribbon plastic mulch layer was purchased for use in county gardens to lay plastic on the ground and secure it with soil. The mulch layer is leased through Board Supervisor, Ronnie Gabbert for a daily fee of \$40.00. A no-till seeder is rented by farmers and landowners on a minimal feeper-acre basis of \$8.00 an acre or \$40.00 whichever is greater. The seeder is leased through Crittenden Farm Lawn and Garden. In 2021, the District placed an order for a new no-till seeder that will arrive later this year. A lime spreader aids local producers in amending steep hillsides that commercial spreaders cannot reach. The lime spreader is leased through the Grant County Conservation District Office for a daily fee of \$30.00.

In 2020, the Grant County Conservation District created a Dead Animal Removal Program for Grant County landowners/farmers that contact a licensed hauler within 24 hours after the death of livestock to schedule a pickup. Animals that are eligible for the program are cows, goats, hogs, horses, sheep, etc. The landowners/farmers are required to pay the total cost of the hauler's bill and bring their paid receipts to the District Office for 100% reimbursement. The program will continue until funds are exhausted. This program is made possible through a \$7,500 grant from the Kentucky Division of Conservation State Cost Share Environmental Program and a \$2,500 match from the Grant County Conservation District. To date \$5,950.00 in grant and district funding has been reimbursed to Grant County landowners/farmers.

Due to COVID-19, the 2020 Kentucky Association of Conservation Districts State Convention was cancelled. The Grant County Conservation District Board Supervisors and staff attended the 2021 KACD Area 5 Meeting through Zoom.

The Grant County Conservation District recognizes that a well-educated society will be more aware and receptive to implementing conservation practices to preserve and protect our natural resources. This process must start in the elementary schools and continue into adulthood. To achieve conservation through the process of education, the District is proud to report the following activities:

- Transportation funding is available for local school field trip requests.
- A \$900.00 grant is available to each of the county's five elementary schools, two middle schools, and two high schools to establish maintain or replenish an outdoor classroom.
- The 2020 Art and Writing Contest entitled "Exploring Kentucky's Mighty Oaks" had 2,600 student entries. There were 1,800 posters created and 800 essays written. A total of 131 classrooms and 6 schools received funding from the District for obtaining 100% participation. For the 30th consecutive year Crittenden-Mt. Zion Elementary had 100% of their student body participate in the contest, Dry Ridge Elementary, Mason-Corinth Elementary, Williamstown Elementary, Williamstown Middle School and Williamstown High School also obtained 100% school participation. The total amount of District funding provided for the 2020 Art & Writing Contest was \$9,895.00
- Due to COVID-19 the Grant County Conservation District Board of Supervisors were unable to host their Annual Awards Banquet in March. The twenty-seven Art and Writing Contest winners (top three from each participating school) were mailed their awards again this year. The three highest rated students in each category also received county awards.
- The Grant County Conservation District distributed through the Grant County High School FFA and the Williamstown High School FFA 3,000 willow oak trees to the county's five elementary schools in celebration of 2021 Arbor Day at a cost of \$2,100.00 for the trees and their bagging & delivery.
- The remainder of 2020 Soil Stewardship Week bookmarks and activity booklets themed "Where Would We Bee Without Pollinators?" were hand delivered to the Grant County Public Library for 2021 Soil Stewardship Week. Originally, the remaining items from the 2020 Soil Stewardship Week were to be delivered to the five elementary schools in the fall, but due to COVID-19 school closures, this was not possible. In early 2021, COVID-19 guidelines were still in place so no new materials were ordered.
- Two \$1,000.00 college/university scholarships (one per each high school) are awarded each year to deserving high school graduates in the District.
- Two \$1,000.00 technical/vocational scholarships are also available for high school graduates.

- Project Graduation was supported at Grant County High School and Williamstown High School. Each high school received a \$200.00 donation.
- The Northern Kentucky University Grant County Foundation for Higher Education received \$5,000.00 in funding for their support and efforts in maintaining a local branch center where both associate degrees and a bachelor degree may now be obtained. In 2021, the funds will be used to help pay for a new roof on the facility, as well as other facility upgrades associated with an older building.
- \$4,000.00 in college scholarships (\$2,000.00 per semester) are available each year to non-traditional students who attend the Northern Kentucky University Grant County Center. In 2021, the Grant County Conservation District Board of Supervisors approved increasing the Grant County Conservation District Non-Traditional Scholarship at the NKU Grant County Center to \$2,500.00 a semester/\$5,000.00 a year beginning with the 2021 Fall Semester. A non-traditional student is defined as a person who never attended college or failed to finish and wishes to enter college to pursue a defined course of study as an adult. The recipient must be a 3 year resident of Grant County. The award is given based on financial need and the recipient's ability to complete the course work.
- \$100.00 was donated to the Kentucky Association of Conservation Districts' Auxiliary Scholarship Fund.
- Two students can apply for funding to attend the Kentucky Forest Leadership/Entomology Programs.
- A \$1,375.00 grant was approved for the Grant County 4-H Council to send five 4-H students to the 2021 Summer Camp at North Central 4-H Camp located in Carlisle, KY. The 2021 Grant County 4-H Summer Camp will be held Aug. 2-5, 2021.
- Funding is provided each year to send ten students to Camp Robert Webb a conservation camp located in Grayson, Ky. In 2021, the District provided a total of \$525.00 for the three Grant County students that applied to attend Camp Robert Webb.

In conclusion, we would like to express our thanks to all the local organizations, state and federal agencies, volunteers and sponsors whose efforts and energies have helped to make all the district programs successful again this year.
